## Peace River Brigade: Passing the Paddle Info' Note #2 2020 March 16

Are you a Voyageur Canoe Team Captain and anxious to participate in a historic celebration of Voyageur history? Then consider Paddling the Peace River from July 7 to 13th 2020!.

Combining history with paddling, this family friendly Voyageur Brigade is 6 day trip down the Mighty Peace River from BC border to the town of Peace River. This is a scenic wilderness run, on a largely deeply incised river that played a significant role in the exploration and opening of trade routes to the Pacific: Alexander MacKenzie wintered at Fort Dunvegan before completing his transcontinental crossing in 1793,



Cost per team will be \$2000 with a \$300 Pre-Registration fee required per Team Captain.

Registration for crew member and individual paddlers will begin in April. All paddlers must be pre-registered as members of CVBS to participate on the Brigade.

While we are under the target size limit, and we are scheduled for after what is hoped to be the start of returning to whatever the ''new normal'' turns out to be, the organizing committee will follow the guidance of public health officials during this extraordinary time.
